

Forest conservation and management






 Our rangers remain the unsung heroes of our conservation efforts we are pleased to report a month completely free from any illegal logging activities.









This February raises the question, when do seasons start...














Ecological reconstruction



We are getting ready, but we haven't set a start date yet

- Experience from previous years has shown us that the weather in March and April can be unpredictable. You never know if you'll be able to plant when you want to.
- We do have big plans for this spring. We'll be replanting on the following sites: Dobroneagu, Valea Lungă, Groapele, and Basa. Additionally, we'll finish the work at Tămaş and Comisu in the Dâmboviţei Valley.
- Flaviu Răuţă, our colleague responsible for growing seedlings in the Foundation's nurseries, is preparing 70,000 seedlings of spruce, sorb tree, sycamore, and Silver fir to be planted this spring. They are prepared and adapted to the mountain conditions. We still have a few thousand in the nurseries, but they are not yet big enough, which is why we have had to buy a further 180,000 beech and spruce seedlings.

Wildlife monitoring

We don't yet have the grace of lynxes, but our mobility has certainly improved with the new lynx monitoring study. After retrieving most of the image cards, the most exciting part of the work starts: identifying each individual lynx.










Each to their own

The cameras specifically installed for monitoring red deer also needed some attention during the past month - and they never fail to deliver great images of this majestic species.

In February we reached 20 cameras on Rucăr, Izvoare, Stoenești, Râul Târgului, Bârsă, Piatra Craiului and Șercăița.









Bisons, beavers and... some wolves on a walk

- The bison in the Nucşoara enclosure still require extra food, so we've been working to provide it for them. Additionally, near this enclosure, a camera trap captured footage of a pack of seven wolves. It's fascinating to observe the interaction between these species.
- To monitor the stress levels of bison during different periods, we collected faeces samples from 30 individuals that will be analysed for their cortisol levels.







Shh, the beavers are resting

Beavers are still not very active in February.

We're currently preparing documentation for the upcoming beaver trapping and relocation campaign this spring.



When it's too warm, it's hard to sleep and hunger keeps bothering you

The warm weather has awakened the bears. We've been vigilant, making sure the electric fences are operational in sensitive areas. We acquired a thermal imaging drone for wildlife conflict prevention and electric fencing, thanks to a donation from Ursus.


Conservation Enterprise Programme








Travel Carpathia



Awards


The festival 'Cobor beteween Oaks' was awarded the trophy for Debut at the Gala Awards of the Year in Culture Braşov 2023.

Communities


- We continue to run schools and kindergarten programmes, as well as distribute food in Nucşoara and Lereşti, in collaboration with our friends from the Casa Bună Association.
