We have successfully been testing drones to help us monitor what is happening on the ground. Especially on sloping terrain at high altitudes, where accessibility is difficult, this is very useful to understand changes happening in the forest.

The data, processed with the help of Artificial Intelligence and filtered by the experience and knowledge of our rangers, will help us make faster and better decisions for forest restoration in the Făgăraș Mountains.


Our rangers installed two information boards in the Vidraru area, southern Făgăraș Mountains. Shepherds of a passing flock lent a helping hand. Thank you!

We track biodiversity in beaver reintroduction areas. We took 100 water samples and took them to the lab for analysis.


Alongside the classic recipes, such as green walnut jam or cherry jam, Poiana Fermecată also surprises you with niche recipes such as dandelion jam. At **Poiana Fermecată** you can find sauces, jams, syrups, zacuscă (vegetable spread made with roasted red peppers), fruit juice, made responsibly, from local ingredients.



Bunea Wildlife Observatory

Surrounded by forests, far away from civilisation and overlooking Lake Pecineagu, Bunea observatory is located on the southernmost flank of the Făgăraș Mountains. Here you can enjoy a **wildlife watching experience** that will allow you to enter the wilderness of the Carpathian Mountains from the safety of the cabin. At sunset and sunrise, wildlife such as bears, lynx, wolves, deer, boar or bison (the latter reintroduced by our Foundation to the southeastern Făgăraș Mountains) might show up on Bunea meadow.

The observatory can accommodate up to six people in three bedrooms, one with a double bed and two with bunk beds. Guests who come here enjoy an all-inclusive package: full-board accommodation, transportation, specialised guide, organic food and drinks. 
